Notes on the schedule:

1. REPORT CARDS will be sent home by Friday, February 10, 2012
2. Mid-term test (for year-long courses) and exams will all be written in the PAC.
3. If there is/are (a) snow day(s) during the exam time (Jan. 25, 26, 27, 30, 31), the whole schedule will move ahead, so that all subsequent days, as well as day one of Semester II, will move ahead by the number of snow days.
4. Be ready 15 minutes prior to the start of the exam time to hand in your books. Your teacher will be in the main hallway outside the office to collect them. If you have a GRAPHING CALCULATOR (grades 11 and 12 math courses), make sure that you check the serial number of the one you have against the one on record with your teacher PRIOR to the exam week. The calculator must be returned on the exam day along with your math textbook.
5. Remember, that if you no longer have the textbook(s) or the calculator loaned to you at the beginning of the semester, you will not be allowed to write the exam. The replacement prices can be found on the BOOK LISTS posted on the bulletin board by the office.

EXAMINATION PROCEDURES: Students of Unity CHS (January, 2012)

Examinations are a culmination of a semester's work; therefore they must be written Jan. 26, 27, 30, 31, 2012, unless you are ill, or alternative arrangements have been made with the administration no later than Friday, Jan. 20, 2012.

- All examinations and mid-term tests (for year-long courses) will be written in the PAC; they all start at 9:15 or 1:00. Ensure that you arrive at school at least 15 minutes before the exam starts.
- If you are ill for an exam, your parent(s) must inform the school immediately on the morning of the day of the exam.
- You will be allowed to take these materials into the exam room with you:
 - pencils and pens,
 - water,
 - calculator.

Before each exam:

- Hand in the textbook(s) that were issued to you at the beginning of the school year (or its equivalent monetary value) to your teacher, who will be in the main hallway.
- After your teacher has collected your books, you are invited to wait until you are called into the exam room.
- You may not enter the PAC before permission has been granted by the supervising teachers.
- You must enter the PAC quietly and orderly. Please sit in one of the designated rows.

During the exam:

- Each exam period will start with devotions.
- Absolutely no talking will be tolerated after devotions. If you talk, you may lose the right to write the exam.
- Any form of cheating will forfeit credit for the exam.
- You may not leave the exam room without the express permission of a supervising teacher.
- Teachers will answer questions for mechanical clarification only.

When you are finished writing the exam:

- No student may leave the exam room before one hour has passed (1 ½ hrs. for Grade 12 U or M courses).
- After that time, you may quietly leave the exam room at any time after you have finished checking over your answers.
- Exam question sheets must be turned in with your answers.
- Put your name on all the sheets you hand in.
- Organize your pages at your seat.
- Bring your completed exam to the teacher, and quietly leave the PAC.
- After you leave the PAC, you will not be allowed back into the PAC; you are asked to stay clear of the PAC and the upper floor of the school, to go and work in the Student Commons (moderate noise will be allowed) or the Library (quiet study only), or "to head on home".
